
I have come to the conclusion that in these times, less is more.

Print NW's Mask Makers

AS CORONA FIRST HIT, MANY OF YOU MAY REMEMBER THE MASKS WE MADE AT PRINT NW.

A LOT OF US TEAMED TOGETHER TO HELP MAKE THOSE, BUT THEY ARE NOT THE ONLY MASKS THE PRINT
NW COMMUNITY MADE. SEVERAL OF US SPENT OUR FREE TIME MAKING MASKS AND DISTRIBUTING THEM
WHEN THE SHORTAGES FIRST BEGAN. TAMARA HAKALA, JENNIFER VAUGHAN, AND THE TRAN/LE HOUSEHOLD
ARE AMONGST THOSE PEOPLE.

Tamara was taught to sew when she was five, although she has had to relearn it many times over the years, as she didn't need to use this skill very often. When the use of masks was first being recommended, Tamara began making them for family and friends since she had the skills to make them. But she came to decide that having the sewing experience would also allow her to help distribute masks. To do this, she put them up on her Etsy shop so that anyone could get their hands on her masks. She also distributes them by word of mouth where and when she can. The best part for her is being able to make use of a skill of hers she does not get to use very often. By now, Tamara thinks she has made a few hundred masks, although she doesn't get requests for them as often as she used to.

For those interested in sewing, whether for mask making or otherwise, Tamara recommends beginning with simple projects, and using YouTube videos to get how to's. But she is also willing to help walk people through the processes. For her, she feels that the old tricks did her a lot of good, more than learning any new ones when it came to helping her with the sewing and mask making processes.

Phuong Ep Nhien Le

Phuong and her sister, Nhien, have also been distributing masks, and although Phuong is helping to make them, the mask maker of the family is Nhien's husband, and Phuong's brother-in-law, Hai Trieu Tran. Some of you might remember him from the Offset presses.

Hai has extensive familiarity with sewing. Many years ago, before he married Nhien, he owned his own business where he sewed clothes. It has been a long while since then, though. When the shortages and high demand for masks began though, one of Phuong's sisters gave Hai a mask design she had made so that he could begin making masks himself.

Phuong estimates that her family has made about 1,000 masks so far. Although the sewing was Hai's work, Phuong, and other family members, helped by doing a lot of cutting to save Hai time. Phuong and her family have distributed their masks by hand and word of mouth, as either donations or sold goods. They have distributed them to friends, family, extended friends of family members, a pharmacy and other places too. One of their neighbors works at a nursing home, and he has requested many masks for everyone who works and lives there. The neighbor is currently the only person still asking for masks though, because otherwise, many people have the masks they need and want, and they are a much easier item to get now.




Jennifer Waughan

She really enjoyed the process, and made masks for those around her, and put them up on Etsy as well to make it easier to distribute them. Jennifer has made over 300 masks since she began earlier this year, but that she rarely makes them anymore. If she were to begin making them as much as she used to, she would like to incorporate nose clips so that they stay up on your face and don't slide down.

- Access PACE and hover over the Product Menu
- From the Product Menu select SDS Lookup
- Use on of the search fields to locate the product in question
- Once located, click the SDS link at the far right, which will open the Safety Data Sheet
